SHOW & TELL - Other Hobbies Night

Gene B talked about "Gold Panning Techniques". The presentation captured the imagination of the members, and he fielded a number of questions about gold panning rules, how to filter out gold from dirt, and how dry rockers worked, among others. Gene B. also talked about a piece of equipment called a "Long Tom" and various sluicing techniques.

Mike B talked about his hobby of collecting and restoring antique "Cast Iron Skillets", including how to clean and restore them using Lye and a copper brush, and how to "season" them by applying Crisco and heating them in a low-heat oven. He also talked about where to find them, how to determine their age, and which ones are considered "collectable".

Steve Johnson presented a talk on his hobby of collecting "Fossils". He displayed a heavy Amorite fossilized fish collection, and a number of other items including petrified wood, a Trylabyte (250 million years old), and a fossilized Orthocerus/octopus. The collection was fascinating to the members.
