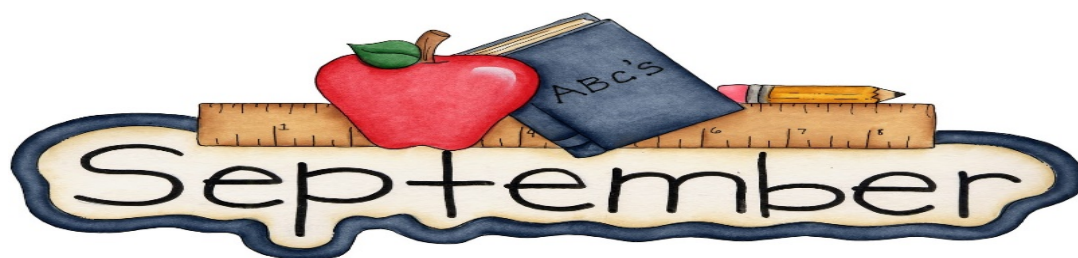

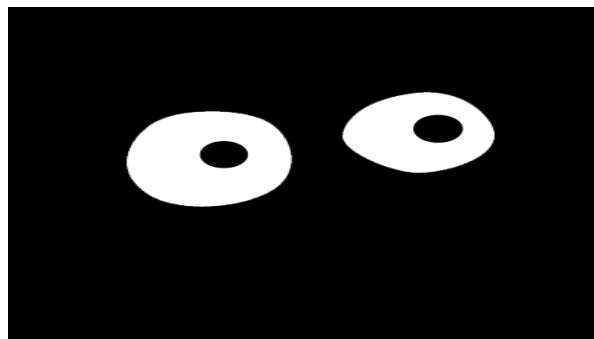
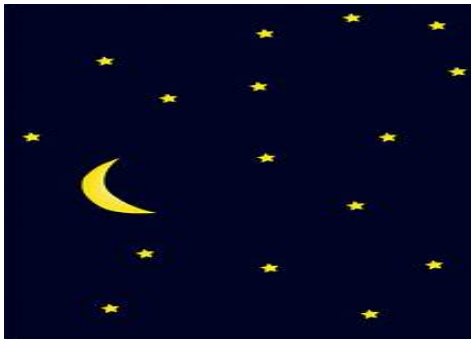
October 24th----“Show your silver rounds” If you have a Halloween silver round maybe win a pumpkin? Pizza Night (Donations requested)
